HAMITIC: The First Christmas Story By Simon Burris

The narrative of Jesus' birth and proof of his Hamitic (Black) African bloodline began in the Old Testament in the book of Genesis chapter 10, in the Land of Ham, located in southwest Asia and Africa. HAMITES: Sons of Ham: Cush (Ethiopia); Mizraim (Egypt); Put (Libya); Canaan (Palestine/Israel).

- (1) Abraham; patriarch of the Hebrews. [Babylonian: Ethnic-Ethiopian] Genesis 11
- (2) Ruth; the great-grandmother of David. A Moabite: Palestinian Arab [Ethnic-Egyptian] Ruth 1; Matt.1:5
- (3) Isaiah; prophet; foretold the coming of the Messiah; a nephew of Uzziah king of Judah (of Hebrew-Canaanite lineage); an ancestor of Jesus. 2 Chron. Matt.1;8,9
- (4) David, Israel's greatest king; a descendant of Abraham, Ruth, also Canaanites Tamar and Rahab. (Ancestors of Jesus). Matt.1:3,5
- (5) Edomites were of mixed Hebrew/African/Canaanite stock. [Genesis 36]

Hamitic people and places are underlined.

<u>Mary</u> the virgin mother of <u>Jesus</u> and her husband <u>Joseph</u> the "foster" father of Jesus, a carpenter, lived in <u>Nazareth</u> a town in northern <u>Palestine</u>.

At this time Emperor Augustus of the Roman Empire decreed a census would be taken. Everyone in his domain had to go to his or her hometown to register. He ordered <u>Cyrenius</u> (<u>Quirinius</u>) the <u>Afro Roman</u> governor of Syria / Judea district to take charge and supervise the mandate.

Both Joseph and Mary were of the lineage of David, Joseph descended from David's son <u>Solomon</u> (and Bathsheba), and Mary extended from another son <u>Nathan</u>. Therefore, they were required to go to the little town of <u>Bethlehem</u>, in Judea and there, in a cattle shed Jesus was born. (Bethlehem is 70 miles south of Nazareth and 5 miles south west of Jerusalem.).

A short time later, <u>shepherds</u> from the <u>countryside</u>, as well as, <u>Wise Men (Magi)</u> from neighboring <u>countries Arabia</u>, <u>Babylonia</u>, and Persia traveled to the <u>nativity site</u>, paid homage and worshipped the infant-Savior.

Now Joseph was warned by the Lord in a dream <u>Herod</u> the <u>Edomite</u> king of Judea was plotting the murder of the child, fled with his family to <u>Egypt</u>, returning to Nazareth after the death of Herod. Jesus had <u>siblings</u>, <u>brothers Joseph</u>, <u>Simon</u>, <u>Epistle</u> writers <u>James</u>, <u>Jude</u>, and several <u>sisters</u>. The last mention of Joseph occurs in the Gospel of Luke when he and Mary took the 12-year-old Jesus to Jerusalem. Mary played a vital role all through Jesus' life, from the day He was born till the time of the crucifixion.

Conclusion: The four Gospels Matthew, Mark, Luke and John chronicled the full themes of Christ as the Universal Savior.

Footnotes: Why is Christmas celebrated on December 25? [The ancient Romans celebrated the winter solstice on December 25 as the birthday of the SUN; the <u>Babylonians</u> and Persians -SON of the SUN. Some 300 plus years after Jesus' earthly demise, Roman Emperor Constantine in 336 legalized this date as the birthday of the SON of GOD – JESUS the CHRIST! Originally: [Christ's Mass].
